Dear Colleagues,

Every year Water and Sanitation for the Urban Poor (WSUP) organises a Project Implementation Workshop that brings together our project teams, the WSUP Projects Group, senior staff from our local service provider (LSP) partners and sector colleagues. The meeting aims to promote cross project and cross sector learning. In 2009, the meeting took place in Nairobi, from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> November, and was attended by project and LSP staff from Madagascar, India, Bangladesh, Ghana, Zambia, Mozambique and Kenya. The workshop included two days of discussions around the question "How can water and sanitation services to the urban poor be scaled up?" The attached report summarises the findings, and draws on recent evidence from WSUP programmes and elsewhere.

One of WSUP's five Strategic Objectives under our 2008-2012 Business Plan is to "Provide learning for the sector on how to accelerate progress towards improving water and sanitation services to the urban poor."
